

Volume numbers are separated from page numbers by a colon, e.g. 79:8.

Volume:page numbers for maps and photos are in italic. Illustrations are also in italic, with the suffix 'i'; tables with 't'. Titles of books and reports are in italic.

Photos and illustrations are of adult butterflies and moths unless stated otherwise. Headings relate to butterflies unless stated, e.g. 'overwintering'

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
